- 1. Parent engagement in the planning, review, and improvement of the
 - school's Parent/Family Engagement Policy.
 - Communication between the Parent/School/Community Council and the Wildcat Parent Teacher Association.
 - At the September 19, 2023, PSCC/WPTA Meeting, the attendees were informed of a revision system in September/October 2023 for parents to review and provide feedback on the Parent and Family Engagement Policy Home School Compact.
 - The 2023 Parent/Family Engagement Policy and the Home School Compact can be reviewed, and feedback can be provided to the principal.
 - The finalized versions of the Parent/Family Engagement Policy and Home/School Compact will be shared at the PSCC/ WPTA meeting and will be posted for all parents and families utilizing all of our communication tools.
- 2. An annual meeting to inform parents of Fulton's participation in the Title I program and explanation of requirements and parent right to be involved.
 - At September 2023 PSCC/WPTA meeting the Home/School Compact and Parent/Family Engagement Policy were agenda items along with the Title I program overview and Pittsburgh Fulton participation level in the Title I program.
- 3. Parent meetings and parent conferences will be held at different times of the day.
 - PSCC/WPTA meetings will be held in the evening monthly beginning with the pre-meeting activity at 5:30pm and the regular meeting at 6pm.
 - Parent conferences will be held as indicated on the district's school calendar for 2023-2024. There will be nontraditional school hours scheduled to provide for flexibility.
 - All other meetings or parent conferences will be determined via teacher and parent availability.
- 4. Title I funds may be used to pay reasonable and necessary expenses.
 - School-wide programs supporting reading, math, and science in the classrooms for meeting the school standards in citizenship, academics, and attendance.



- Educational field trips supporting state standards in reading, math, and science, and other associated expenses related to the event, such as transportation.

- Principal, ITL1s, Intervention Specialist and Teachers will provide information and if needed descriptions/explanations in the areas of curriculum, assessments, and expected benchmark levels at the school and parent meetings.
- Teachers will provide ongoing communication with parents, addressing all aspects of their child's education at Pittsburgh Fulton.
- 10. The school will provide assistance to parents in understanding the PA State academic content standards and student achievement standards, local academic assessments, and how to monitor a child's progress and work with teachers to improve the achievement of their children.
 - Pittsburgh Fulton will collaborate with the entire learning community to facilitate the PA Common Core State Standards (PA CCSS), student achievement standards, local academic assessments, monitoring children's progress and work with teachers to improve the achievement of their children through voluntary training sessions and the monthly PSCC/WPTA meetings.
- 11. The school will provide, if requested by parents, opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children, and respond to any such suggestions as soon as possible.
 - Classroom or instructional issues should be brought to the attention of the teacher who the subject that child is struggling in.
 - Issues that cannot be resolved at the teacher level are suggested to be taken to the administrative level.
 - Opportunities for parent meetings with teachers and other school officials are available before, during and after school as the appropriate parties involved are available and the appropriate channels for requesting the meeting are followed.

 - As needed or requested, staff will conduct on-site training sessions in any areas of the curricula to foster student achievement and parents' content knowledge for homework and tutoring purposes.
 - PSCC/WPTA agenda items can be generated based on parents' needs to support the learning home/school connection with the child.
 - Curriculum nights will be offered as part of the premeeting activities to explain District curriculum, PA CCSS, local and state assessments, and to showcase student work.

- The was an interactive activity collected for Ms. McClean's workshop and teachers indicated on chart paper what their best communication tool is for communicating with parents. At the Welcome Back To School Night Fulton families identified their favorite communication tool with staff. This created a great visual that determined Talking Points was the most effective tool for communication with Fulton Families and Staff
